

Family members or professionals may contact the program directly. Central Intake will review new referrals. Parents may be as ked to give more information about their child's needs before the referral is forwarded to the most appropriate agency.

How will information be shared?

Parents or guardian must give consent so that information can be shared.

Parents, therapists and other team members work together to set goals and make a plan to meet the child's needs.

Where will services be provided?

Services may be provided in a variety of settings depending upon the needs of the child and family.
