Society for Manitobans with Disabilities (SMD) Ethno-Cultural Services



GETTING HERE

Directions to and from the Airport/Bus Depot

From the Airport/Bus Depot (2000 Wellington Avenue): 5.1 km

- Start out going southwest on Wellington Avenue toward Administration Street (2.4 km)
- Turn left onto St. James Street (1.1 km)
- Take the second right onto Dublin Avenue/City Route 57. Continue to follow City Route 57 (1.6 km)
- Make a u-turn at Wall St. E onto Notre Dame Avenue/City Route 57 (if signage permits) (.02 km)



✤ 1155 Notre Dame Avenue is on the right.


To the Airport/Bus Depot (2000 Wellington Avenue): 4.8 km.

- Start out going northwest on Notre Dame Avenue/City Route 57 toward Wall Street (0.9km)
- Turn slight left onto Dublin Avenue/City Route 57 (1.2 km)
- Turn left onto King Edward Street/City Route 90 (1.1 km)
- Turn right onto Wellington Avenue (1.0 km)
- Continue on Wellington Avenue to the airport/bus depot at 2000 Wellington Avenue (0.6 km)

- Parking for families is provided directly in front of the main entrance at no cost (see highlighted areas above). Please register your vehicle license plate number at the Security desk as you enter the building.
- Visitors may use the pay-as-you-go parking stalls located on the west side of the building. The parking kiosk is located at the exit of the building in front reception

Idle-Free Zones

 All entrances and loading zones are idle-free zones to prevent vehicle exhaust from affecting staff, especially those who work near the doors. Vehicle idle-free zones are enforced by the Security Guard.

Business Hours


SSCY Centre regular business hours are Monday – Friday, 7:45 a.m. to 5:15 p.m., during which staff are at the Reception desk.



AMENITIES

Front Reception

Front reception is the first point of contact for families and visitors. Receptionists are located at the front entrance of the building to:

- Direct families and visitors to individual service/reception areas.
- Receive and direct general inquiries.

SSCY Concierge/Helper

The SSCY Concierge is located in the front reception area and is here to help families of children with disabilities with:

- Moving equipment in and out or within SSCY Centre.
- Lifts and transfers of your child
- Parking or supervision of your child while you park your car
- Finding your way around the building and getting to your appointment

Strollers and Wheelchairs for Family Use

There are various types of strollers available for family use within SSCY Centre. They are located near the security desk in the front reception area.

Lockers for Family Use

There are five lockers available for family use in the Family Resource Centre. Locks may be signed out through reception.

Dropping Off and Picking Up Client Equipment

Larger equipment (such as trikes, bikes, wheelchairs, seating devices and standers) must be dropped off and picked up at the Shipping & Receiving entrance located on the west side on the building. There is an intercom that can be used to alert the staff of your arrival.

Smaller items (items that could easily fit on top of a desk, such as toys) can be delivered to and picked up at the Reception desk in The Square.

Washrooms with Change Tables

Washroom with hydraulic change tables and lifts are located on the main floor.

Waiting Areas

Are located in the following areas:

- The Square
- Clinic Crossing
- Innovation Station
- Success Heights

Family Kitchenette (coffee and vending)

The Family Kitchenette is located in The Square. It provides access to vending machines, coffee, microwave and fridge.

Family Quiet Room

A low-stimulation/quiet room is located in the play area of The Square.

Central Park – Indoor Play Space and Atrium

An indoor Play Space is located in Central Park. This treed and light-filled atrium space features a walking and riding path, benches, water-feature and interactive activities accessible to children of all abilities.

Discovery Park – Outdoor Play Space

Families are welcome to use the fenced garden and outdoor play space located at the west end of the building. In this treed space are located a sitting area, tables with umbrella and chairs, sand and water play area, talking tube, wind chimes, and drums.

Smoking

SSCY Centre and grounds are designated smoke-free.

The Electronic Medical Record (EMR)

The SSCY co-locating partners use an EMR to keep track of your child's health and service history in a secure password-protected electronic database. It keeps your child's history in one place, including health conditions, medications, and services received. Service providers can make better decisions about services when they have a complete picture of your child's health and service needs.

The SSCY Family Resource Centre is located in The Square. In this family-friendly centre, families will find over 2500 harder-to-find resources about special needs and general health issues, including:

- books, videos and DVDs about specific disabilities or conditions

- books addressing the concerns of siblings and parents
- general parenting resources
- education issues
- ✤ pamphlets
- newsletters

Families are welcome to sign out most resources for a four-week period. We are able to mail print and video resources to Manitoba locations outside of Winnipeg.

Internet Access for Families

Children and families are welcome to use the SSCY Family Resource Centre's computers. SSCY Centre also has public Wi-Fi; the password is posted in the waiting areas.

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
Resource Loan Programs
